Livestock Prize Money Pick Up

- Prize money will be paid by e-transfer to the email address provided on the entry form.
- If e-transfer is not possible, a cheque may be requested. Cheques will be available for pick up at the Fairgrounds during the week following the Fair.
- Any cheques not picked up will be mailed to the address provided on the entry form.
- All cheques must be cashed by November 30 of the year they are issued. Cheques not cashed by this date will be cancelled, and the unclaimed prize money will be considered a donation to the Peel Agricultural Society.

Livestock Division Rules & Regulations

1. A valid Peel Agricultural Society membership is required for all exhibitors. Exhibitors 18 years of age or older who do not have a current valid membership will be charged a \$10.00 membership fee, which will be deducted from any prize money earned. Memberships for exhibitors under 18 years of age are provided at no charge.
2. Exhibitors receiving \$20.00 or more in prize money will have \$10.00 deducted from their winnings to purchase a Peel Agricultural Society membership for the following membership year.
3. Livestock Exhibitors must enter the fairgrounds through the Livestock gate located on Old School Road.
4. Exhibits and livestock must arrive within the times specified for their division. No livestock will be permitted in the Livestock Building prior to these times. Unless otherwise stated, all exhibits and livestock must remain on display at the fairgrounds until judging has been completed. Failure to comply will result in the forfeiture of all prize money.
5. Complimentary admission is provided to Livestock exhibitors and one handler. All additional attendees must pay regular gate admission. Exhibitor and Handler must enter in the same vehicle.
6. The Peel Agricultural Society reserves the right to refuse admission to or remove any person from the fairgrounds at any time for reasons deemed appropriate by the Board of Directors or its authorized representatives.
7. All entries must be submitted on the official entry forms provided by the Peel Agricultural Society. Entry forms are available:

 - b. By emailing fair@peelagsociety.com
 - c. By visiting the Peel Agrihub office at 12942 Heart Lake Road, Caledon, Ontario.
8. Unless otherwise stated, all entries must be made by the bona fide owner of the exhibit.
9. Unless otherwise stated, all divisions and classes are open to residents of Ontario, Canada.
10. All entry tags and prize ribbons must remain attached to exhibits and animals while on display. No previous award, medal, exhibitor name, or identifying mark that could reveal the ownership of an exhibit may be displayed until judging has been completed.
11. All entry fees must accompany entries submitted by mail. Exhibitor and entry tags will be available for pickup at the Fair Office. Entry tags are non-transferable.
12. No exhibitor shall compete for or receive more than one prize in any class unless otherwise specified.
13. Special awards, prizes, and sponsorships are subject to change without notice. Additional awards or prizes secured prior to the Fair will be presented where applicable.
14. If, due to inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances, Fair revenues are insufficient to cover operating expenses, the Peel Agricultural Society reserves the right to reduce prize money by an equitable percentage.

16. Prize cheques must be cashed on or before November 30 of the year in which they are issued. Any cheque not cashed by this date will be cancelled, and the prize money will be considered forfeited and donated to the Brampton Fall Fair.
17. Directors reserve the right to substitute goods in place of cash prizes in any class.
18. Exhibits or animals not ready for judging at the designated time will forfeit the right to compete.
19. All exhibitors are required to carry their own liability insurance and must provide proof of insurance upon request. In addition, all exhibitors must sign the Peel Agricultural Society's Hold Harmless Agreement before participating in the Fair.
20. Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring all required health certificates and documentation accompany their animals. Animals requiring health documentation under applicable regulations will not be permitted to unload without the appropriate paperwork.
21. All livestock exhibited must be in good health and free from all diseases. The Peel Agricultural Society reserves the right to refuse entry to or remove any animal deemed to be unhealthy or unfit for exhibition. Animals entering Ontario from outside the province must meet all applicable provincial and federal health requirements and be accompanied by the required health documentation.
22. The humane treatment of all animals is expected at all times. Any exhibitor found mistreating or neglecting an animal may be disqualified and required to remove the animal from the fairgrounds.
23. Classes will be judged in the order in which they appear in the Prize Book unless otherwise directed by the Peel Agricultural Society.
24. Where there is insufficient competition or the quality of an exhibit does not warrant an award, judges may withhold any prize at their discretion.
25. Any protest regarding a judge's decision or the eligibility of an exhibit must be submitted in writing to the Peel Agricultural Society within 24 hours of the decision. The protest must clearly state the reason for the complaint, be signed by the complainant, and be accompanied by a \$100.00 deposit. The deposit will be forfeited if the protest is not upheld. All protests will be reviewed by the appropriate committee, which has the authority to investigate and make recommendations to the Board of Directors. The decision of the Board of Directors shall be final.
26. While the Peel Agricultural Society, its Board of Directors, officers, volunteers, and representatives will take every reasonable precaution to ensure the safety and security of all animals, exhibits, and property, all exhibits are entered at the exhibitor's own risk. The Peel Agricultural Society assumes no responsibility for any loss, damage, injury, or theft of animals, exhibits, or personal property, or for any injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, attendants, or spectators while on the fairgrounds. By entering the Brampton Fall Fair, exhibitors agree to release and hold harmless the Peel Agricultural Society, its Board of Directors, officers, volunteers, and representatives from any claims arising from participation in the Fair and further agree to indemnify the Society against any claims arising from their exhibits, animals, property, or participation in the Fair. While every reasonable precaution will be taken to prevent accidents, the Peel Agricultural Society accepts no responsibility for any accident, injury, loss, or damage occurring on the grounds of the Peel AgriHub.

26. No exhibitor or representative shall be present while judges are carrying out their duties unless specifically authorized. Any person who attempts to influence or interfere with the judges, directors, or officers of the Society, or who uses abusive, insulting, or inappropriate language toward any judge, director, officer, volunteer, or Society representative, shall forfeit any prize money or awards to which they may otherwise be entitled and may be prohibited from exhibiting for one year. Judges and Society officials are requested to report any violation of this rule immediately. Any disqualifications under this rule or the following rules may be published with the official awards.
27. Any exhibitor found to have engaged in fraud, deception, dishonest practices, or misrepresentation regarding the ownership, preparation, or eligibility of an exhibit may have any or all prize money withheld and may be disqualified from competition at the discretion of the Peel Agricultural Society.
28. The Peel Agricultural Society reserves the right to correct any printing, typographical, or other inadvertent errors or omissions contained in this Prize Book.
29. The Peel Agricultural Society reserves the right to interpret, amend, or supplement these rules whenever necessary. The decision of the Board of Directors shall be final.

The Peel Agricultural Society has adopted the classifications recommended by the Canada Department of Agriculture and the following rules apply:

- An exhibit is defined as a unit of livestock qualifying for entry into a class as specified in these classifications.
- An exhibit shall be interpreted as follows: All purebred registered animals, whether owned by one person or jointly by two or more persons, that are maintained on one farm or breeding unit shall be considered the production of that farm or breeding unit.
- For the purposes of these classifications, where the same or common interests exist in more than one breeding operation, those operations shall be considered one breeding unit. Where there is any doubt as to whether more than one breeding unit exists, the interpretation shall be that only one breeding unit exists. The responsibility for proving the separation of breeding units rests with the exhibitor(s).
- The Peel Agricultural Society reserves the right to exclude any ineligible animal or any animal that cannot be positively identified prior to judging.

1. All dairy cattle must be on the fairgrounds by 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, September 20, 2026
2. An entry fee equal to 20% of prize money earned will be deducted unless otherwise specified.
3. Dumping of milk anywhere on the fairgrounds is strictly prohibited.

Sheep Competitions

Rules & Regulations

1. All sheep should be on the grounds by 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, September 19, 2026 and must remain until 4:30 p.m.
2. All exhibits must be owned by and registered in the name of the exhibitor. All animals must be legibly tattooed.
3. The Peel Agricultural Society requires each class of sheep to have at least three (3) exhibitors and eighteen (18) exhibits shown in the ring to qualify for full prize money; otherwise prize money will be reduced by 50%.
4. Breeding animal exhibitors may enter as many eligible animals as they wish. However, they may exhibit only one animal per class, except that they may exhibit two animals in up to two classes of their choice.
5. An exhibitor may not show more than two breeds of sheep.
6. The following breeds must be shown in short fleece (staple less than 1 inch or 2.50 cm):
Dorset, Hampshire, Suffolk at shows that fall between April 1st and October 14th inclusive.

1. Field entries close Monday, September 14th, 2026; all other entries close Thursday Sept 17th, 2026 at 11:30 a.m.
2. Grain to be shown in containers provided by Fair.
3. Exhibitors may only show one entry per class but may enter in every class in section.
4. All grain and seed must be grown by the exhibitor in 2025 and 2026 and not treated.
5. No two persons can show products from the same field.
6. The quantity to be shown in each class: half bushel of grain; quarter bushel of seed; 3 flakes of hay.

JUDGING NOTE: In Field crops to be scored while standing in field near maturity. Consideration is given to purity of variety, freedom from weeds and other plants, freedom from plant disease and insects, stand and vigor of crop, neatness of headlands, fences, etc. To make corn field crops eligible, eight ears and six stalks must be exhibited at the fair from that field. The ensilage or grain corn (at fair) will be separately judged on its own merits.

14. Artistic Display: The artistic display will depict a topic related to “Agriculture” using seeds, grains and field crop materials.
 - a. Displays are to be mounted with a raised border to protect the display. Size: NOT TO EXCEED 15”x15” (37cm x 37cm) by 1.5” (4cm) deep or exhibit will be disqualified. The materials used do not have to be produced by the exhibitor; they may be procured from local producers. Creativity with the topic is encouraged!
 - b. Please note entries from previous years will not be accepted in the current year. If the exhibitor is using the 4-H logo, please ensure it is the Canadian or Ontario 4-H Logo. If using a logo in your artistic display, the only logos permitted are the 4-H and RAWF logos.
 - c. The seed, grain or plant materials may be coloured prior to application to the display board base. NO PAINTING, COLOURING OR TINTING OF THE MATERIALS ONCE THEY ARE ATTACHED TO THE DISPLAY BOARD.
 - d. A border is required to protect the entry from damage due to handling.
